
Blessed be God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Blessed be God's kingdom, now and for ever.

1 Thessalonians 2: 1-13

¹ You yourselves know, brothers and sisters, that our coming to you was not in vain, ² but though we had already suffered and been shamefully maltreated at Philippi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition. ³ For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery, 4 but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. ⁵ As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; ⁶ nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others, ⁷ though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. 8 So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us. 9 You remember our labour and toil, brothers and sisters; we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you while we proclaimed to you the gospel of God. ¹⁰ You are witnesses, and God also, how pure, upright, and blameless our conduct was towards you believers. ¹¹ As you know, we dealt with each one of you like a father with his children, 12 urging and encouraging you and pleading that you should lead a life worthy of God, who calls you into his own kingdom and glory. 13 We also constantly give thanks to God for

this, that when you received the word of God that you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word but as what it really is, God's word, which is also at work in you believers.

- ³⁴ When the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together,
- ³⁵ and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him.
- ³⁶ 'Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?'
- ³⁷ He said to him, ' "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind."
- ³⁸ This is the greatest and first commandment.
- ³⁹ And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself."
- ⁴⁰ On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.'
- ⁴¹ Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them this question:
- ⁴² 'What do you think of the Messiah? Whose son is he?' They said to him, 'The son of David.'
- ⁴³ He said to them, 'How is it then that David by the Spirit calls him Lord, saying,
- 44 "The Lord said to my Lord,
- 'Sit at my right hand,
 - until I put your enemies under your feet' "?
- ⁴⁵ If David thus calls him Lord, how can he be his son?'
- ⁴⁶ No one was able to give him an answer, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.

Nicene Creed

Let us together affirm the faith of the Church We believe in one God, the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.
